

Ridgecrest Baptist Church Worship Choir FAQ Sheet

Do I have to audition?

No. We won't put you on the spot to sing by yourself.

Do I have to know how to read music?

No. You will learn about reading music as a part of your choir experience but you will not be expected to come knowing how to read it. There are several people in each section that read music well and can help you learn your part.

What if I can't be there every Wednesday?

We understand that there are weeks when you will be out of town, have job issues, a child will get sick or something unforeseeable will happen. We ask that you be here on Wednesdays unless providentially hindered and on those times, let us know.

If I'm not here on Wednesday, can I still sing on Sunday?

Yes. If you have been regularly attending, you will know the song that we are singing. We usually work on songs 6 weeks in advance so you will have worked on the song for that Sunday several times.

Do you provide Childcare?

I don't know what voice part I sing (Soprano, Alto Tenor or Bass)

We can help you figure that out. Talk to Greg at your first rehearsal and he will temporarily put you in a section. If you realize that part is too high or low for you, you can switch to the other section.

Some of the most valuable choir members are those that aren't the most talented singers. You can be a great worship leader without having a great voice. God is not limited by your talent or lack of. Be available to him and see what He can do!
